Secured the 20MPH limit outside St Andrews School to make our roads safer for our kids.

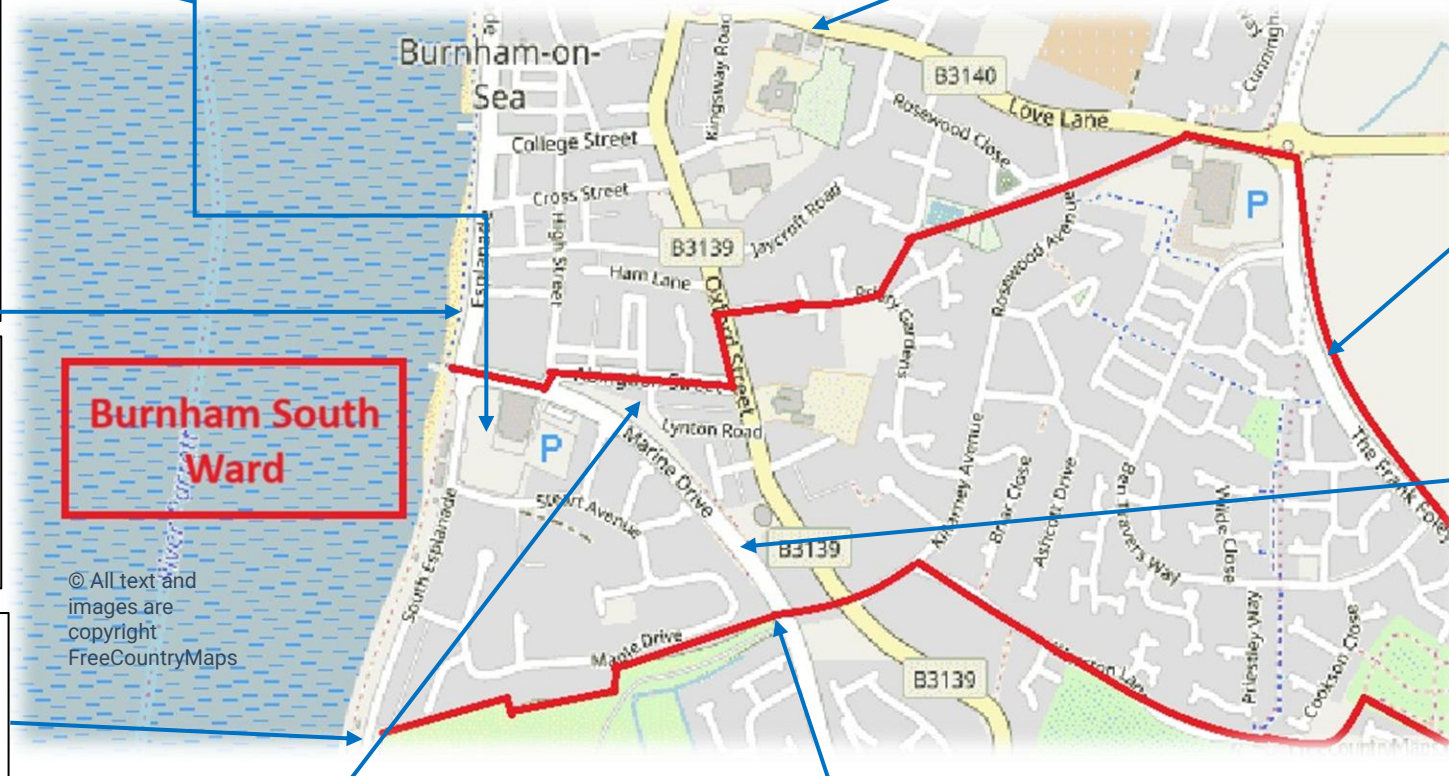
Campaigning for old BT Phone Boxes to be replaced by street hubs to provide Wifi, emergency calls and fast charging.

Insisted on increasing CCTV coverage following a public consultation on where hot spots are in response to public demand.

Greener Burnham

The Liberal Democrats led the council to declare a **Climate and Ecological emergency** in September 2022. After organising a meeting to bring together interested members of the community, they then created a Climate and Ecology Working Group to lead the development of a 4 year plan. Out of this work satellite groups were formed, including the Repair Café, Plastic Free, Growing Group, Bus User Group and the Brue Green Pathway Group.

In 2024 **The Green Team** was formed. All the satellite groups continued with the new group except for the Growing Group which is now a volunteer group for the Town Council.

The group continues to support new groups that share our aims and values. We have launched a **'Foster a Tree'** project to increase tree coverage throughout the towns. Our residents have responded enthusiastically and we are now working with the Town Council, Somerset Council and Live West to identify places to plant the trees in the next few years.

We are also exploring ways of making our town easier to walk and cycle round.

Our next project will be an opportunity for residents to put **solar panels** on their roof using a local firm.
